



## Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum – Year 9

Over the course of the year the Keeping Safe; Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) will be taught as a compulsory part of the curriculum. Although parent permission is not required under the Education Act (1972), we encourage parents/caregivers to seek further clarification if required and to provide the teacher with any relevant information about their child that could alleviate any concerns.

The Curriculum has 2 main themes:

- We all have the right to be safe
- We can help ourselves to be safe by talking to people we trust
