On Friday 29 March all teaching staff engaged in professional learning onsite. This learning supports teachers to continue to build on and refine the positive and meaningful learning experiences we strive to provide for students across all year levels. Mid-Year Intake

We are currently accepting enrolments for Term 3 this year. We ask that an Application for Enrolment form be filled out for any new children starting. This form can be requested from our website or collected from the front office at any time. The relevant dates for new Receptions are:

- If your child turns 5 on or before the 30
 April they can start school in Term 1 of that year.
- If your child turns 5 on or before the 31 of October they can start school in Term 3 of that year.
- Children starting in Reception in Term 3 will have a minimum of 6 terms in Reception.
- Children whose birthdays fall between 1
 November and 31 of December are not eligible to commence school before the following year.

We are committed to continuing to work in close partnership with local preschool educators to ensure that families make informed decisions that best suit the individual needs of each child. If you have any questions regarding enrolling your child and/or starting dates please contact the school and we will happily help you.

Science - Year 1/2 Gold

Psychology - Year 11

The Stage 1 Psychology class has been working through the forensic unit. By looking into how criminal minds work and unpacking how profiles are created to find suspects, the students were able to investigate their own 'crime scene' using the 5 steps in which they needed to present their suspect profile. In small groups of 'FBI' teams, the students worked their way around the evidence to apply their content learning into practical action.







Caritas K's - Year 11

The SACE Stage 2 Integrated Studies course for Year 11 students includes the study of Justice in the Community. Students are required to participate in an action, where practical involvement in promoting justice in the community, will provide them with an opportunity to apply their knowledge and understanding of local and global justice.

To help raise awareness of the needs of others living in developing countries the students participated in a Caritas Ks event during their lessons on Wednesday 20th March by walking from school to Gladstone Square. Students walked in solidarity with those who have to walk vast distances to access resources we take for granted, such as clean water, education and medical facilities. The students will be seeking donations for the 4.2 kilometres covered on the day and all monies raised from the event will go to Caritas Australia to help with their work around the world.

The students participated in the event with a real sense of purpose and enthusiasm and should be very proud of their efforts.
