#### **NAPLAN**

Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be involved in Literacy and Numeracy Testing, (NAPLAN Tests) in Week 3 of this term (14th - 16th May). It is important that your child attends school on these days. These tests provide useful data for individual achievement in comparison with national standards and are a means of identifying particular needs at each year level. They are, however, one mode of assessment in the overall learning program and Caritas College uses a variety of assessment strategies. - religious freedom in schools



Once again, we will be participating in the Woolworths Earn & Learn program.


