
Federal Election Update - Make your vote count for your child's education

Catholic Education supports a strong, proper funded public schools sector - All Australian students should have access to a quality education, no matter which school they attend

- Catholic school parents are also taxpayers and deserve a fair share of government funding support to keep their children's schools affordable
- By keeping Catholic schools affordable, one in five Australian children can attend a school that reflects their parents' values and beliefs an important feature of a pluralist society
- Catholic schools save taxpayers money; without affordable Catholic schools, taxpayers would need to fund 100% of the cost of educating Catholic school students, instead of around 70%

Uni Hub

Uni Hub Spencer Gulf is a community-owned, tertiary education centre, supporting locals wanting to study at university, without having to leave the region. The Uni Hub will offer tertiary courses that address skills shortages in the region, enabling people living in Port Augusta and the surrounding regions to gain the skills and training necessary to fill vacancies in the current and future workforce within the region. The vision of Uni Hub Spencer Gulf is to create a self-reliant and thriving community.

This means that as of 2020 online university courses will be made available for local people to study, along with a Port Augusta Uni Hub campus that provides students with the support, space and technology to study individually or in groups. Students studying with the hub's university partners will also receive face-to-face mentoring and tutorials to assist them in achieving their academic goals. We are asking all students in Year 10, 11 and 12 to complete an online survey to assist Uni Hub in making decisions about course offerings.
