#### Art – Year 5/6G

#### Aboriginal Art – Reception Gold

The Reception Gold class have been working on their Aboriginal art and learning about the Dreaming Stories. In particular, the story of the Rainbow Serpent. They did their own drawing of the Rainbow Serpent with coloured chalk on the primary courts.





#### Learning Assistance Program (LAP)

The program is offered to students from Rec to Year 6 where a student works with a volunteer on a range of activities like the development of fine/gross motor skills, reading and writing activities, craft activities etc, depending on the needs of the student.

Our VET students have been attending TAFE throughout the year in various courses such as; Electrotechnology, Construction, Automotive, Hospitality and Business.

Some of the activities our students have undertaken are: testing switches with voltmeters, using a simulator generator, mig welding, making a saw stool and mortise and tenon joining. Our students are thoroughly enjoying their learning experience, gaining skills and knowledge in their chosen career pathway.
