Therefore, almost 30% of our students achieved an 'A' for this compulsory Stage 2 subject. There is not long to go, but there is still lots to do! For the time being though, I applaud their achievements in the Research Project and acknowledge the efforts of the teachers and parents who supported them in these great achievements.

Student Free Day

On Monday staff engaged in professional learning onsite. Specifically, we engaged in learning around a project that we are involved in called the IDEAS Project. The IDEAS (Innovative Designs for Enhancing Achievements in Schools) Project is a whole school, two-year revitalisation project developed by the members of the Leadership Research International (LRI) located at the University of Southern Queensland. On Monday we analysed the data from a survey that staff, students and parents recently completed. In total 239 surveys were completed (students 165, staff 42 and parents 32) which was a generally positive response. This initial analysis of the quantitative data from the survey provides insights in to our College's 'successes' and 'challenges'. Our involvement in this project demonstrates our commitment to ongoing learning and continuous improvement.

Child Protection

At Caritas College, child protection is our highest priority. Creating a safe environment for children is paramount and is central to our schoolwide policies and procedures. Our staff are committed to protecting the young people in our care. Below are some of the measures that are in place at our College to ensure the safety and protection of your child:

- All staff and regular volunteers have current police checks.
- We teach our students age-appropriate strategies to keep themselves safe through South Australia's Keeping Safe Child Protection Curriculum.
- All staff complete mandatory training including 'Responding to Abuse and Neglect' (7 hours) and regular refresher child protection training every 3 years, as legislatively required.
- We promote strategies to minimise bullying and help students stay safe online.

Mathematics – Year 9

Our Year 9 students have been analysing statistical data this week. Students gathered data on the colour, weight and quantity of m&ms. There were some interesting observations approaching measurement, mass, capacity, average and popularity.



HASS – Year 9

During Term 2 the Year 9 HASS classes explored elements of the First World War. This followed through how the war started, what factors contributed to Australia getting involved, different battles including Gallipoli, how the ANZAC legend was formed and looking at ways we commemorate soldiers now. This was the base for their final assessment where they needed to design a museum display and guide the Year 5, 6 and 7s through. Each student was required to pose their own research question about a topic and answer using knowledge they gained during this unit. Along with the formal written part they were given the opportunity to make a model or poster for their display.



Work Experience – Year 119

In Week 10 of Term 2 whilst our VET students attended TAFE, the remainder of the Year 11 cohort spent 4 days on work experience.

Placements ranged from retail to health, education and news broadcasting. On the last day of term the group returned to school where they shared their experiences with the rest of the class and completed a reflection task.

Highlights of the week included

"I had the opportunity to "scrub up" and assist with a dog surgery. This was a unique experience that I found both interesting and exciting."

"My favourite part of work experience was being able to experience how different teachers prepare their classes".

"Interacting with customers and gaining an understanding of the job they wanted complete and what work that would entail."

"I really enjoyed getting up and being ready for "work" it got me into a routine as such"

"Being able to conduct an interview and write our own article of our choice"

"Creating a meal plan for someone with Huntington's disease"

"Being allowed to independently utilise lab equipment to view and experiment on zebrafish embryos"

"Learning about the complex procedures that occur within the company; not just general X-rays, CT or Ultrasounds"

"Working with the young children who were non-verbal, because I got to learn how to use the pod"


"Being able to learn different things about different vehicles"
