St Mary 'of the Cross' MacKillop

On the 8th August each year we celebrate the Feast Day of St Mary MacKillop. It is a special day for our school community, along with many other Josephite schools scattered throughout Australia. This year marks the 110th anniversary of Mary MacKillop's death. Earlier this year, I had the privilege of visiting Mary MacKillop Place in Sydney, which is where she lived in her final years and is now buried. Inscribed on the side of her tomb are the words "Trust in God". May we trust in God in the same way that St Mary MacKillop did and be a positive difference in the lives of all those we encounter.

Ever generous God, You inspired Saint Mary
MacKillop to live her life faithful to the Gospel of
Jesus Christ and be constant in bringing hope and
encouragement to those who were disheartened, lonely
or needy. We ask that our faith and hope be fired
afresh by the Holy Spirit so that we too, like Mary
MacKillop, may live with courage, trust and openness.
We ask this through Jesus Christ. Amen.

Science - Year 10

As part of Year 10 Science, students study genetics, inheritance and genes. Students modelled the various patterns of inheritance through creating vegetable offspring or babies. Each offspring displayed different characteristics which were inherited from their vegetable parents. This activity enabled students to see the importance of genetics in the real world.



Year 12 Child Studies – Activity Box

The Year 12 Child Studies class recently undertook a topic about the benefits of creativity and what activities are available for children in the local community. They also researched the possible negative effects of too much screen time.

They then planned and constructed an 'activity box' for a child that encourages creative play. These included a puppet theatre, lava lamps, an aquarium and sand jars.

Students trialled their box with a Year 1/2 student. Everyone had a lot of fun and the children were very excited to take their creations back to share with their classes.









Reception Blue - Monsters

Last term the reception classes learnt about procedural texts. We discovered that procedures tell us how to make or do something. We wrote a procedure that explained how to make a paper bag monster puppet. We then followed our procedure to create some very friendly monster puppets.
