Uniform Review

As many of you will be aware a review of our uniform has been conducted by a committee this year on behalf of the College Board. It was comprised of representatives of all sections of the College community including the Principal, Board representatives, staff representatives, students and parents/caregivers. The committee consulted with the College community to develop an understanding of the effectiveness of our current uniform. The committee also spent considerable time exploring the possibilities of change. The work of this committee is now complete and I sincerely thank the people who volunteered their time to contribute to the review. The outcome of the review will be communicated to the College community early next year. I am foreshadowing that there will be some new and exciting changes to our school uniform. These changes will be implemented over a two year period, once approved, to ensure that families can make full use of current uniform items. Therefore, families can feel confident and assured in continuing to purchase and wear the current uniform for the foreseeable future.

2020 School Fee Schedule

As shared in recent newsletters, the 2020 School Fee Information is now available on our website <u>https://www.cc.catholic.edu.au/ files/f/16445/2020 Fee</u> <u>Schedule.pdf</u>. The new School Fee Schedule has some significant changes that continue to support all families to access a Catholic education in Port Augusta. The below table outlines some of the major changes in the 2020 School Fee Schedule:

	There is no percentage increase to fees in 2020 (excluding school card holders).
	A fourth tier has been included for $R - 2$ students which offers a reduction in fees for families who currently have a student in $R - 2$.
Program	In 2020, we will be commencing a 1:1 Laptop Program for all students in Years 7-12. The implementation of this program will be rolled out over two years. Next year, all students in Years 10-12 will be provided with their own laptop. In 2021, the program will be extended to include Years 7-9. The cost of this device in included within the 2020 School Fee Schedule
	The fee structure has been extended to include the supply of stationery items for all students. Families will no longer be required to order stationery items at the beginning of each school year. Stationery items will be distributed to students on the first day of school in 2020.
	As per the School Fee Collection Policy, the collection of fees is necessary in order to complement State and Commonwealth Funding to assist Caritas College in resourcing education. Therefore, it is deemed both equitable and necessary for all families to contribute towards school fees in the current challenging economic environment. All new students to the College whose families are school Card approved will receive a 75% reduction in tuition fees and will need to contribute 25% of the fees.

Class Placements

Teaching staff have spent considerable time and effort placing students into classes for 2019. A range of factors are considered and inform these placements which include:

- Progress of learning
- Student's individual needs (Social/emotional, learning, physical, behavioural)
- Relationships
- A balance of sexes

Sometimes other factors may also need to be considered. Please be assured that the process for class placements focuses on the overall learning and wellbeing needs of each student. Staffing matters and changes to enrolments can impact on class placements over the holiday period. Therefore, class placements will be communicated to parents during the week prior to school starting next year. This will happen via an email detailing your child's teacher and classroom. A text message will also be sent alerting you that this information has been emailed to you. Therefore, it is important that the College has your up-to-date contact details to ensure that you receive this communication.
