Reception Gold Design & Technology

Year 9 Mathematics

The Year 9 students have been discovering the properties of right-angled triangles in Math, then using Pythagoras' Theorem to compare their measurements against the formula $A^2 + B^2 = C^2$.



Year 10 Home Economics

The Year 10 students have been putting their skills to the test by learning how to make pasta from scratch! Students made their own dough before using a pasta maker to stretch and cut before cooking up either a carbonara or a tomato based sauce.



Year 11 Psychology
