
### **Principal's Renewal Leave**

### Year 5, 6, 7 SRC - GRIP Conference

A number of Year 5, 6 and 7 SRC members recently attended the GRIP Conference. GRIP Leadership is an organisation that exists to train and develop leaders with a special focus on school students and the educational sector. Students engaged in a range of activities to discover what it takes to be a leader, and what they can bring to their leadership position this year.



### Year 8 - Science

The Year 8s recently conducted flame tests to detect the presence of certain metals in chemical compounds. The tests involve heating a sample of an element and observing the resulting colour of the flame.



### Year 11 - Caritas Ks

The SACE Stage 2 Integrated Studies course includes the study of Justice in the Community. To help raise awareness of the needs of others living in developing countries the students participated in a Caritas Ks event during their lessons on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> March by walking to and from school around the local area carrying buckets of water for a distance of approximately 3.5 kms. Students walked in solidarity with those who have to walk vast distances to access resources we take for granted, such as clean water, education and medical facilities. They will be seeking donations for the kms covered on the day and monies raised will go to Caritas Australia to help with their work around the world.





### **Year 12 – Workplace Practices**

As part of the Year 12 Workplace Practices course this term, students have been exploring the changing nature of work. An excursion to Wadlata and then a walk along Commercial Road provided students with an opportunity to learn more about the history of Port Augusta while reflecting and analysing the vast knowledge, skills and competencies required to work in many different industries in the past
