



RECEPTION TERM 3 TRANSITION VISITS

When does my child come for 'transition'?

There are five transition visits which will be held during **Week 9**. Please refer to the below table.

Parents and children are requested to meet at the Front Office on Monday where you will be directed to the appropriate classroom if your child is unable to attend on any of the days, please let the front office know.

Does my child have to wear the school uniform during transition?

No. Most parents may not have bought them yet, but if you have and your child would like to wear them that is fine.

The College has implemented a new uniform in 2021. Reception to Year 2 students wear a 'SmartPlay' uniform all year round. This supports our younger students to be physically active throughout the day. The College has sizing kits available to enable students and parents to come onsite to try on garments to assist them in ordering the right sized items online. Front Office staff will be available and happy to assist families in the ordering process. Alternatively, if more convenient, please bring your child to the front office at the end of one of the transition visits for a fitting. Need to allow up to 7 days delivery time.

Do I have to, or can I, stay?

No, you don't have to. Your child will be going into a very welcoming room. If your child is upset, you might like to remain, but it is best if you can try and 'get away' if you can. Sometimes little ones can be a bit upset, or even reasonably distressed at the 'point of separation' but they usually settle down shortly after parents leave. The classroom teacher is only a phone call away. We do just ask you to be back on time, to collect your child.

Do I have to worry about what my child can and cannot do - eg. Read or write their name, etc?

No. The children are coming just to get familiar with some of the people and the surroundings - the toilets, the playground, the drinking taps, etc. They will do some simple activities and the teacher will be able to glean a little about where your child is 'at', but these sessions will be fun and interactive to ensure that it is a positive experience for your child.

What happens if my child has medication?

If your child has a medical condition requiring medication ie ventolin, please bring 'in date' medication on the first transition visit to the front office. Student medication is stored in our treatment room and students are supervised / assisted when taking their medication by our First Aid Officers. It is important that you have completed and returned the Student Information Check List. If your child has a medical plan, ie Asthma Medication Plan, EpiPen Action Plan, please provide a copy.

What paperwork do I need to return to the school?

Please ensure you have returned the following forms prior to the first transition visit.

- Acceptance Offer
- Photograph/Video/Artwork Consent form
- ICT User Agreement form
- Student Information Check List
- Medical / Health Care Plan (if applicable)

What day does my child start in Term 3?
