Parent/Teacher Learning Conversations

Unfortunately, we have been forced to postpone the Parent/Teacher Learning Conversations that were scheduled to occur in Week 3 due to COVID-19. In order to cater for this important aspect of working with our families to support students, we will now be conducting these over the phone between Week 4 and Week 7.

Parents will receive a SMS on Thursday 5 August 2021 inviting you to book a time for these conversations to occur with your child's teacher(s). Teachers will then contact parents at the organised time and discuss your child's growth and achievement in their learning. Interviews are strictly 10 minutes only as teachers will have a large number of phone calls to make. If you require additional time then this can be arranged at a later date.
