# **COVID-19 and Vaccinations**

During September, South Australian Year 11 and 12 students aged 16 and over can get priority walk-in access for their COVID-19 vaccination at SA Health run vaccination clinics. A letter was distributed last week with information about access for senior students and the opportunity to be fully vaccinated before they finish the school year. Year 11 and 12 students can receive a vaccination without an appointment at Port Augusta or any of the other clinics listed on the COVID vaccine website. We encourage students completing SACE exams and assessments to prioritise their vaccination during September. Vaccination arrangements for other secondary year levels are currently being finalised by SA Health.

#### **Building Project Update**

While we do not yet have a definitive timeline for when we will be able to move back into the Penola Leaning Centre, excitement is growing! The major building works have been completed and the final touches are currently being completed in the learning spaces. The landscaping at the front of the building is almost complete and the nature play space is coming along quickly. The erection of the treehouse has generated lots of interest from curious onlookers over the past few days. We anticipate that we will be able to occupy this space early—mid Term 4.



# **NAPLAN**

Students in Year 3, 5, 7 or 9 who participated in the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) received their results this week. This assessment provides useful data for individual achievement in comparison with national results and are a means of identifying particular needs for individual students and cohorts of students within the College. They are, however, one mode of assessment in the overall learning program and Caritas College uses a variety of assessment strategies. If you have any questions about your child's results, you are invited to have a discussion with your child's teacher or Director of Student Learning & Wellbeing. #### **Learning Portfolios & Reports**

Learning portfolios for Years R-9 and reports for Years 10-12 will be distributed on the last day of Term 3. Students will need to be at school to collect their learning portfolio or report. Due to privacy and confidentiality we do not send reports home with friends or other families. Given that it is an expectation that all students attend school on the last day of term, then they should be able to pick up their learning portfolio or report. We are not able to post these documents out before the term break. If for any reason your child won't be at school on the last day of the term please inform their class teacher and the learning portfolio or report can be picked up from the Front Office by a parent. Otherwise, students can collect their learning portfolio or report when school resumes in Term 4.

#### **Enrolments for 2022**

We are currently mapping out how 2022 will look for our college. We would appreciate any anticipated changes in enrolments to be communicated to Michelle Dunning, Principal's PA as soon as possible. We also ask that an Application for Enrolment form be filled out for any new children commencing in 2022 (both at the beginning of the year and mid-year intake). This form can be requested from our website request an enrolment pack or collected from the front office at any time. Please be aware that we have a **TWO INTAKE POLICY.** See below the relevant dates for new Receptions:

- If your child turns 5 on or before the 30 April they can start school in Term 1 of that year.
- If your child turns 5 on or before the 31 of October they can start school in Term 3 of that year.
- Children starting in Reception in Term 3 will have a minimum of 6 terms in Reception.
- Children whose birthdays fall between 1 November and 31 of December are not eligible to commence school before the following year.

We are committed to continuing to work in close partnership with local preschool educators to ensure that families make informed decisions that best suit the individual needs of each child. If you have any questions regarding enrolling your child and/or starting dates please contact the school and we will happily help you.
