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# Principal's Message

#### **COVID-19 Update**

Generally, it seems like we are becoming more at ease, for lack of a better description, with the ever-present risk of COVID-19. We are, however, constantly being reminded by SA Health not to be complacent. As such, the advice has not changed for schools in relation to COVID-19. Therefore, we will also continue to adhere to the safety measures communicated previously to families.

I remind you that we are limiting non-essential visitors on site, so please refrain from entering the school site unless it is absolutely necessary. We understand that some parents need to come on site to support their child's wellbeing and we continue to support this. If you do need to come onsite for any reason, you are asked to wear a face mask and practice physical distancing.

Mask wearing continues to be a requirement for all adults and students in secondary schools. And, we remind all adults to use the QR codes if they do need to enter the school site.

Thank you for your cooperation with these directives from SA Health. I deeply appreciate the way that our school community has responded to the changing circumstances of the pandemic.

### **Building Project Update**

It is almost 12 months to the day since we announced our capital development project for the Penola Learning Centre and Nature Play Space. Work started earlier this year. At times COVD-19 has interrupted and threatened to slow progress but I'm pleased to share with you that we are nearing the end of the project. The Penola Learning Centre is all but complete, aside from some minor details. We are hopeful that staff and students will be able to move back into this space before the end of the school year. The Nature Play Space is progressing at an exciting rate and is expected to be completed by the end of October. Excitement is building as we edge close to being able to occupy this space at some stage in Term 4.

#### **Enrolments & Transition Date for 2022**

A gentle reminder for families to communicate any anticipated changes in enrolments to the front office as soon as possible. We also ask that an Application for Enrolment form be completed for any new children starting in 2022 (both at the beginning of the year and mid-year intake).

Transition for our new Receptions will be held every Tuesday in Week 5, 6, 7 and 8. This is an important time in the lives of all children as they transition to a new environment and begin to familiarise and build connections with their school community.

Transition for students enrolling into Year 7 and 8 from another school will occur Thursday (Yr7) and Friday (Yr8) Week 8 and an optional Splash Day on Monday Week 9. This will provide students with an important opportunity to develop a sense of familiarity with their new school setting and build relationships with their peers and teachers before they join our College in 2022.

### **CESA Partners in Inclusive Practice – Caritas Parent Survey**

Caritas College is currently involved in a CESA initiative that focuses on targeted literacy instruction and intervention strategies that support all learners. As a part of this process we are seeking input from families with students in Years R-4 through a short 2-minute survey.
